## **MAKES IT OFFICIAL**

### *Jack Reser Files Petitions to Run for House Seat*

BELLEFONTAINE, OH 12/14/07 – Jack Reser, conservative Republican candidate for the Ohio House of Representatives, filed his petitions for candidacy with the Logan County Board of Elections today.

“I’m running for Representative because I want to take our small town values and change the way do things in Columbus,” Jack said. “And judging from the groundswell of support I’ve received, people in our communities agree.”

Reser has pledged to go to Columbus and represent the people in the district, not special interests. He won’t back down from tough decisions, and he’ll put his small business know-how to good use to jumpstart Ohio’s economy.

Reser first announced his candidacy in June and since has been visiting every corner of the three-county district, meeting voters and listening to what’s important to them.

“I’ve already been working very hard. Now that I’ve filed my petitions and it’s official, I’m looking forward to meeting even more people as we campaign across Logan, Marion and Union counties,” Reser continued.

Reser is seeking the Republican nomination this March for the seat now held by State Representative Tony Core, who’s not seeking re-election because of term limits.

Reser currently serves as Logan County Commissioner. During his tenure as commissioner, he fought hard to reduce government spending by cutting commission expenditures by more than \$172,000 and limiting the growth of government to less 1 percent a year. Reser is also a businessman who owns and operates a family footwear store that’s been in business since 1948.

A strong believer in giving back to the community, Reser serves on numerous boards and committees. He and wife of 26 years, Heidi, live in Bellefontaine where they raised their two, now grown, children.
