CONGRESSMAN JORDAN ENDORSES RESER

Candidate for Ohio House earns conservative congressman's support

BELLEFONTAINE, OHIO 12/18/07 – Congressman Jim Jordan (R-Urbana) today announced his endorsement of Jack Reser, conservative Republican candidate for the Ohio House of Representatives.

“Jack Reser has the experience -- and the core conservative values we need in the Ohio Legislature,” Jordan said. “He’ll be an excellent representative for our families.”
